



Electronic Devices – 6-8 Quick List for Daily School Use

Please note that bringing a personal electronic device to campus is now a requirement for 7th and 8th grade students but remains an option for 6th graders for the 2021-2022 school year. Online accessibility at home is an expectation. For 6th grade students, classrooms requiring digital curriculum are equipped with devices.

Device Requirements:

- Physical keyboard
- Internet connectivity with browser capabilities
- Windows laptop or PC, MacBook, Chromebook with modern browsers are all acceptable. We recommend devices no older than four to five years of age.
- iPads and cell phones are NOT an acceptable device for classroom use.
- Approved translators must comply with the school's AUP.

It is expected that all Capital Christian 6-8 students will...

- come to school each and every day with devices fully charged if they bring one.
- bring a pair of earbuds every day.
- clear all open apps/close all windows at the beginning of every class.
- **only** open apps and windows they are given permission to use during each class.
- keep their devices on their desks (not in their laps) or put away during the class period.

Capital Christian 6-8 students may not...

- record audio or video and/or take pictures of teachers, staff, administrators, or students during the school day without receiving prior permission from the teacher.
- open/use devices in the school locker room or any school restrooms.
- share passcode or passwords with any other students.
- use another student's device without permission.
- use apps or websites connected to gaming, social media, music, etc. during class unless permission has been given (between 7:30am-3:05pm).

Before/after school, break, and lunch:

- Students may use their devices appropriately for academic purposes while being supervised by a teacher or staff member.
- School staff maintain the right to check the devices to see what students are doing at any time during the school day.
